

INSTRUCTIONS FOR CARD CENTRE

Cartridges: Plantin Schoolbook, George and Basic Shapes, Storybook, 12 x 24 mat

Materials:

- 3 Sheets of Bazil Bling (or the heaviest weight paper you can find)
- 4 sheets coordinating pattern paper
- 4 sheets of cardstock
- 4 sheets of light weight paper for envelopes
- Chipboard
- Ribbon for bows on note cards and for tags

Directions:

Load Bazil onto 12 x 24 mat making sure that the paper starts at 1" and the piece for the bottom pocket starts at 15". Score these pieces, its easy to see where as all the cuts show you. (I have used a 12 x 24 mat as the box has to be exactly 12" and the virtual mat does not cut a full 12")

Cut the inside panels making sure that you have a small piece starting at 1" for the 2 small pockets and a second piece of Bazil starting at 8" , go to the next page and cut the score marks or if you prefer, score at ½" and 1" from each end on both.

The main pocket you have already cut along with the main box. Again the scoring speaks for itself. Put double sided glue on the bottom and side panels of the main pocket and adhere to the bottom and sides of the main box. The smaller pockets adhere to the main box and the main pocket, making sure you don't cover the score line on the main box or your card centre will not close properly. It's a good idea to glue them together before gluing them to the main box. Refer to picture for placement and how they are folded.

Glue the lid together and embellish as you desire. If you use the scrolls, cut one in chipboard and one in cardstock, glue together for dimension.

The original design called for magnetic snaps to close the box, but I found it was better to not use anything.

Next, cut 4 cards 5 ¼ " wide and 4 ¼ " deep. Adhere the patterned pieces to the front of the cards and embellish as you desire.

Cut 4 note cards 3" x 3". Glue on the patterned paper you cut out for them and embellish as you desire.

Cut 4 tags 2 1/4 " wide and at least 3" high. Embellish as you wish. I haven't put the ribbon in the top of them yet.

I have not cut the envelopes yet, but they look as though they should cut out ok.
